Special Council Meeting

August 21, 2019

Meeting called to order by Linda Waite, Mayor.

Roll call by Sharon Anglemyer, City Clerk. Attending were Deb Bader, Chris Mead, Phyllis Agee, Paul Umble and Joyce Link, council members. Mayor, Linda Waite and City Clerk, Sharon Anglemyer.

Also attending were Ron Smith, City attorney and Steve Samuelson NFIP Specialist, Division of Water Resources, Kansas Department of Agriculture.

First item on the agenda was the KDHE payment. The amount was not seen correctly by the mayor and had been resolved prior to the meeting. No action taken.

Steve Samuelson was introduced and explained FEMA regulations following the audit he had done in February of 2019. Mayor, Linda Waite asked if someone had reported a problem that prompted the audit. He informed the council that this is common practice and in reviewing the area following the tornado of May 16, 2018 on google maps, there were some noticeable changes. Mr. Samuelson came to Pawnee Rock to meet the code enforcement officer and the city clerk after driving around and looking at the locations showing changes in the floodplain areas.

Mr. Samuelson clarified FEMA information and answered questions from council and audience.

There are two open citations on property's belonging to Terry Mead: one is a carport that needs to be anchored down, the other is a pile a wood chips (mulch). Mr. Mead had told the city the carport is secured, he told Steve Samuelson he would sign the floodplain permit and return it to the city office.

Steve Samuelson offered an alternate solution for the mulch, in that Mr. Mead would secure it with a covering of chicken wire and a secure fence. Mr. Mead agreed to this solution for the mulch pile.

In the business of a therapy animal, Mayor Linda Waite asked Ron Smith, city attorney, where the city stood in relation to our ordinance prohibiting livestock in town. He explained there is a difference in a therapy animal and a service animal. He stated a municipal judge would make the decision on the issue of a baby calf being on a property within the city of Pawnee Rock was reported by owner to be a therapy animal.
